



Sample for creating "My Timeline"

1 Check the Target Area for Evacuation Information Issuance sticker for your home (P62, 63), and use the "Target Area for Evacuation Information Issuance sticker" of the corresponding issuance category.

Decide what to do beforehand, when it will be done and who will do it, depending on your family structure and the risks of your area.

Example



Mr. Ibaraki has a home in an area where there is a risk of inundation of 3 to 5 m due to flooding of Ai River, etc.

2 Check the alert level, evacuation information, and disaster prevention weather information that can be used as a guide to Prepare to Evacuate and for Evacuation start. Evacuation information and disaster prevention weather information related to heavy rain are important information and are common to all people. For disaster prevention weather information related to floods and landslides, put a checkmark (✓) in the information required depending on the area where you live.

5 Consider the details of Prepare to Evacuate and the time it takes for all evacuation preparations, and adhere the sticker related to Prepare to Evacuate. Add the actions that are not on the sticker by writing them, considering your family structure and living environment. Also, consider not only your own family but actions such as calling out to your neighbors and the community as well.

Be sure to evacuate by Alert Level 4!

When (information that can be used as a guide for starting the action)

Increase your awareness in case of a disaster and be fully prepared for it.

Check your evacuation measures in preparation for evacuation.

People who need extra time to evacuate and their supporters should start the evacuation.

Start evacuating by this time at the latest.

5 Prepare to evacuate sticker

3 Since the available facilities differ depending on the disaster, enter the evacuation destinations arranged on the check sheet for each type of disaster. It is effective to evacuate not only to the evacuation destination designated by Ibaraki City, but also to a safe home of a relatives or acquaintance.

4 Based on the timing of evacuation and travel time arranged on the check sheet, adhere the sticker related to evacuation start and evacuation end. People who need assistance for evacuation (elderly people, disabled people, infants, etc.) and their caretakers should start evacuation by using Alert level 3 (evacuation of the elderly, etc.) and information equivalent to Alert Level (heavy rain or flood warning, flood alert information) as a guide.
